How much change would you get?</i></p>	<p>Create a quiz of 10 questions for someone at home about different coins.  <i>E.g. How many sides does a 20p have? What colour is a 1p?</i></p>	<p>Find out how many different ways you can make 50p.  <i>Remember to use different coins. E.g. 20p+20p+5p+5p= 50p</i></p>	<p>Can you find change for items when paying with 50p? £1? £2?  <i>Challenge: Can you practise using a decimal point to show pounds and pence? e.g. 76p= £0.76</i></p>	<p>Add together different amounts.  E.g. Orange 24p Chocolate bar 65p  How much altogether?</p>

E.g Mrs Hendry made a pinecone mobile with her daughter Eva 😊 There are lots of ideas of Pinterest!</p>	<p>Compare another country to the UK. What is the same? What is different?  Hint: you could choose somewhere you have been on holiday, somewhere else you have lived before or choose somewhere completely different and do lots of research!</p>	<p>Make an alphabet of things you can find in your house: A- Apple B- Ball  Challenge: Can you use alliteration too. e.g A-Awesome apple B- Bouncy ball C-Crunchy crisps</p>
