Perhaps an adult can test you. Remember: when the longer (minute) hand is pointing to the 12 it is something o'clock. Then you just have to look at the shorter (hour) hand to see which hour it is.	Once you have mastered telling the time to the hour – try telling it to half past the hour. <i>Remember: the minute hand will now be half way round the clock, pointing at the 6. The hour hand will be half way between two numbers, it is half PAST the number the hand has gone PAST.</i>	Make a timetable of a typical day at home for you. What do you do at different times? You could include: having meals, doing some reading, play time, going for a walk, having a bath, brushing your teeth etc.
