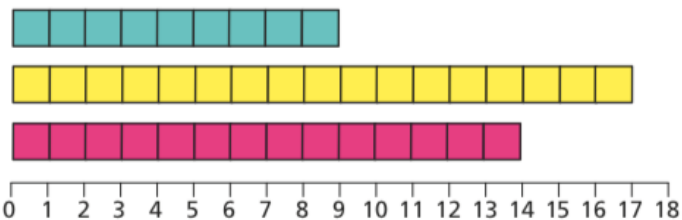

Fabulous Friday

There are **Seventeen** kinds of penguin, but the Emperor is the only one that breeds in Antarctica in midwinter. The adults arrive at their breeding areas — often as far as 200 kilometres from the open sea — in late autumn. A few weeks later the female lays her single egg and returns to the sea, leaving the male to keep the egg warm until it hatches a couple of months later.

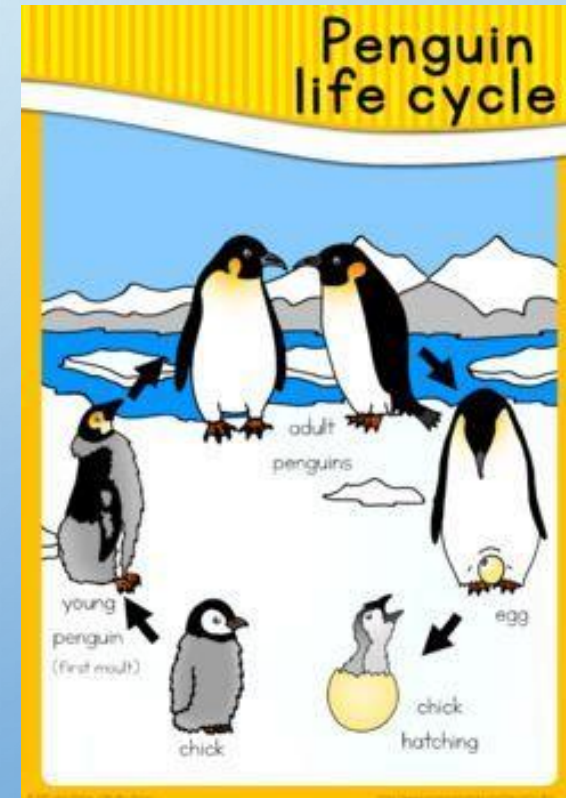
At first the male and female take turns to look after the chick. But soon it is big enough to be left while both parents go fishing for its food in the sea. By the time it's four months old, the young penguin's coat of fluffy down has been replaced by adult feathers.

It now also sets off for the sea, where it has to start looking after itself.

This is a page from the beginning of 'The Emperor's Egg'. It describes the lifecycle of an emperor penguin.

Discussion: There is lots of technical vocabulary e.g. breeds, lays, egg, hatches, chick, coat, adult, feathers. Do you know what these words mean?

Here is a simple emperor penguin lifecycle. Can you draw your own and add labels using the technical vocabulary above?
