
Using the information you have found out about Polar bears have a go at making your own information book. This will be your draft, your first attempt.

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


Complete the patterns of different coloured 2D shapes. It is a multiple choice game with three levels of difficulty. It is excellent for shape recognition and for problem solving.

We hope you that you had fun making your book yesterday. Today we are going to have a go at editing. This is a very good skill to learn and you will need to use it lots during your time at school.

Firstly, re-read your book out loud to a grown up and then discuss how you could improve it.

- Did you use capital letters and full stops correctly?
- Did you remember finger spaces?
- Have you included conjunctions such as, 'and' and 'because'?
- Does your writing include adjectives?
- Was the information clear?

Once you have decided how to make your writing, edit your book and then re-write it.


