The start of next term marks the existence of 20 years of education support within Peterborough for pupils with autism. That's when I started on a temporary basis working for Peterborough City council as their Autism Outreach teacher. The council had decided there was a need to provide some support for pupils, but they didn't know how it would work or evolve. Fast forward twenty years and now we are a team of nine with a combination of teachers and LSA's.

I remember providing training in schools with an overhead projector if you were lucky, now we have the wonders of PowerPoint and Teams so training can also be accessed from work or home. This has meant that training and advice is easier to access and has increased the number of individuals who can attend training.

New research and the development of new interventions like Zones of Regulation, Attention Autism and the Curiosity approach have all had a huge impact on our students. As time moves on it's great to find new and better ways to support our students. As a society we talk about autism and neurodiversity much more, we see the opportunities and successes that our CYP achieve and increasingly there are more role models in the media for our CYP. Recently there has been a rise in the number of girls with autism and we are helping schools to understand how differently girls can present and how best to meet their needs.

The Sensory Corner SLEEP

Sleep is complicated and can be impacted by a variety of factors. Some of these factors might be related to sensory processing. People with a hypersensitivity to sound might benefit from having some background noise. Research has shown that different frequencies of noise (white noise, brown noise, pink noise) can help cancel out different sounds that people might be hypersensitive to.

Studies also show that blue light (the type of light emitted from screens) has a negative impact on sleep patterns. So, screen time just before bed is best avoided. Some people have a hypersensitivity to different fabric types so the types of pillows and bed sheets used can make a big difference. Consider the type and flavour of toothpaste used and whether brushing teeth/washing/bathing earlier in the evening rather than just before bed might help.
